

**JIM BROGAN TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP  
DEPARTMENT OF SEXUALITY STUDIES  
FALL 2009**

This scholarship is established in the name of Dr James Brogan, Professor of English at SFSU. He is a distinguished teacher with an exemplary writing career in support of sexuality studies. Notably, Jim Brogan taught the first course on homosexuality at the university in the later 1960s. Throughout his career, Jim has worked with students, encouraged their writing and professional development, and is a great friend to the Department of Sexuality Studies. This scholarship will be awarded to the eligible graduate student in the Sexuality Studies Master of Arts Program who is selected as the best teaching assistant. The scholarship recipient will be announced at our Sexuality Studies Capstone Ceremonies on May 23, 2009. The scholarship will be disbursed in the Fall 2009 semester.

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**Eligibility:** You must be currently enrolled as a graduate student at SFSU in the Master of Arts Program in Sexuality Studies with a minimum GPA of 3.0. You have been (or are currently) a teaching assistant in a Sexuality Studies class at SFSU. You must also be a continuing student the following fall semester enrolled in at least 6 units. Please note that it is the responsibility of the applicant to determine the impact of this award on their financial aid and taxable income status.

- Unofficial copy of transcripts demonstrating a GPA of 3.0 and above
- One letter of reference from your faculty mentor(s) whom you have worked with as a teaching assistant.
